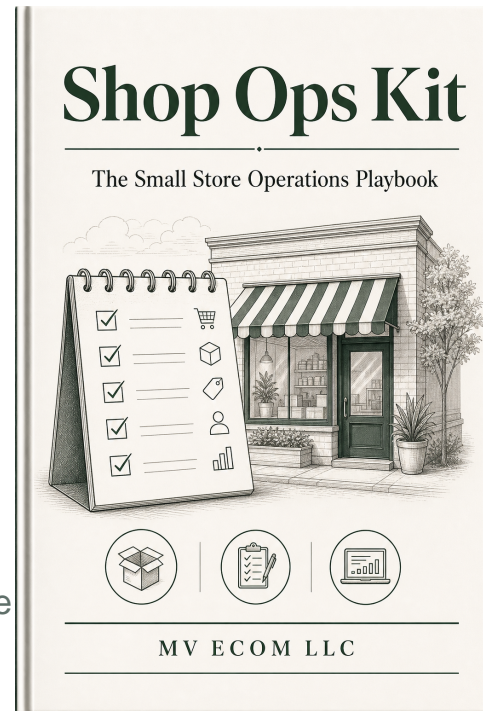

Chapter 1

Store Readiness

Confirm that the public buying path still matches the product, delivery method, and support promise.

A store review starts with the customer path. Open the storefront in a clean browser, move from home page to product page to cart, and write down every point where a buyer might pause.

The goal is not to redesign the store every week. The goal is to keep essential information visible: product details, delivery expectations, return terms, contact paths, and checkout clarity.

Use a single review sheet so issues become visible over time. Repeated issues should turn into operating rules, not one-off fixes.

- Define what ready, waiting, and resolved mean for this process.
- Keep a short example of the correct outcome so the next review is easier.

Chapter 2

Product Page Quality

Turn product review into a repeatable check instead of a subjective copy exercise.

A product page should answer the buyer's practical questions before it tries to persuade. Confirm title clarity, images, variants, dimensions, compatibility notes, delivery details, and support expectations.

Mark each page as ready, needs copy cleanup, needs image cleanup, or needs policy clarification. This keeps page work operational instead of subjective.

For a small catalog, review every active product monthly. For a larger catalog, rotate by top traffic, top support volume, and recently changed pages.
